I name is Denny Quitugai Taimanglo and am both a son of Guam and proud Chamorro . I am writing to you to express my concern regarding the Programmatic Agreement you are being asked to sign in order to proceed with plans for the Guam Military Build Up.

I respectfully urge you and our local senators to call for a public hearing and refrain from signing the Programmatic Agreement without first listening to the wishes of the People of Guam.

As a son of Guam and son & nephew of many military officers and leaders, the current build-up plan is unacceptable. Your endorsement of the Programmatic Agreement would validate the incomplete and profoundly damaging proposal for the build-up. The DEIS and the current FEIS continues to ignore the significant implications that the proposed build-up will have on Guam's precious resources and our rich cultural heritage.

I understand that the Programmatic Agreement has placed an immense weight on your shoulders. You should not bear that weight alone. Listen to your people and let us help you make this invaluable decision.

Also I would like you to know that I am proud to be an American citizen, although I believe that Guam had been taken there independence making there own decision since the Spanish have taken Government over our wonderful Island. I am asking our U.S. Government to leave our heritage, our only soil on which our people are and have been living on and respect our wish not to use it for any additional military purpose anymore.
